THEMATIC CONCERNS

CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION and MITIGATION & DISASTER RISK REDUCTION MANAGEMENT (1)

PMPI hopes to enhance the capacity and preparedness of its partners to respond to and manage the impacts of disasters and climate changes. It is committed to establishing an effective mechanism and structure for responding to disasters and calamities.

GOOD GOVERNANCE, PEACE & HUMAN RIGHTS



PMPI seeks to develop a comprehensive peace-building framework that can foster equitable and sustainable peace within communities and society. Its members and partner communities are dedicated to supporting ongoing peace talks and acquiring community-based peace-building skills related to conflict management.

ANTI-MINING CAMPAIGN (AMC)



PMPI actively engages in an anti-mining advocacy and campaign to address the concerns of its clusters and partner communities, which are adversely affected by mining activities and policies as the government aggressively promotes the revitalization of the mining industry.

The anti-mining campaign aims to raise social awareness about the negative impacts of mining and its social and cultural costs. Furthermore, the network challenges the claims of mining companies regarding "responsible" mining, highlighting the adverse effects of large-scale corporate mining practices in the country.

SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE & FISHERIES RESOURCES CONSERVATION & MANAGEMENT (6)

PMPI advocates and supports the adoption of sustainable agriculture to achieve food sovereignty, empower farmers, and maintain ecological balance.

The approach hopes to build communities characterized by sufficiency and sustainability.



COMMUNITY-MANAGED ECO-TOURISM & WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PROJECT (PROJECT PAGBANGON)

From Project Pagbangon, an integrated island development project in Homonhon and Manicani, which started as typhoon Yolanda post-disaster response in Panay and Eastern Visavas clusters, it has developed to two ecosystem protection projects - eco-tourism and water resource management in Homonhon island.

The project continues to work alongside local people's organizations organized during the Project Pagbangon project as well as local anti-mining organizations -Protect Manicani Island Society Inc. (PROMISI) and Homonhon Environmental Advocates and Rights defenders (HEARD)

PMPI VISION

The PMPI envisions a Philippine society:

- 1. that is humane, equitable and sustainable;
- 2. that promotes holistic development and full realization of human rights:
- 3. that is animated by an empowered citizenry where diversity of cultures, religions and beliefs are valued; and
- 4. where justice, peace, love and integrity of creation reign.

The Co-Conveners Committee (CCC) is the executive arm of the supreme.

PMPI MISSION

In its work for integral human development and social transformation, the PMPI commits to facilitate dialogue, exchange of expertise and experiences, and collective action among PMPI member organizations in addressing common development issues and concerns.

PMPI GOALS

The PMPI shall endeavor to achieve the following end results:

- PMPI and propels it to act collectively
- Member clusters that collectively act to address common development issues and concerns in their respective areas
- A broad resource network providing relevant support to its members





STRUCTURE OF THE PARTNERSHIP

The General Assembly (GA)

The General Assembly is the highest policy-making body of PMPI. It is composed of representatives of all individual member-organizations and it convenes every three (3) years. It is a forum for a continuing dialogue and exchange of learning between and among people's organizations (POs), nongovernmental organizations (NGOs) and church-based groups and organizations. It is an avenue for leadership, confidence-building, and forging solidarity, grounded on issues and concerns articulated by the poor.

The National Coordinating Council (NCC)

The National Coordinating Council serves as the highest policy-making body of the network when the General Assembly is not in session. It consists of one representative from each cluster, referred to as the "cluster point person," the three regional Co-Conveners, the Executive Secretary of NASSA/Caritas Philippines, the National Coordinator and the Deputy Coordinator.

The Co-Conveners Committee (CCC)

Functions as the executive arm of the National Coordinating Council. It comprises five members, with one representative each from Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao, the Executive Secretary of NASSA/Caritas Philippines and the National Coordinator as ex-officio members.

The Clusters

Clusters are collective groupings of member-organizations based on geographical location and/or area of operations. They serve as the primary focal points of the partnership. It is in the clusters where the particular or local development agendas appropriate to their specific context and situation are agreed upon and where collective decisions and actions are initiated. Clusters engage their particular sectors to contribute to the overall PMPI development agenda, national resolutions and agreements of the partnership. The primacy of the clusters in this context is to be respected.

The National Secretariat

The National Secretariat functions as the service arm of the partnership. It ensures coordination and communication with and among partner organizations, and with Misereor.

The Secretariat assists the CCC and the NCC in fulfilling their duties and functions.

The Task Force

The Task Force is a special body established by the National Coordinating Council to provide support to PMPI in analyzing issues, conceptualization and innovation of strategic actions, and addressing urgent and critical issues affecting communities and the nation.
